HEARING: RICHARD AKERS

City Attorney Nelson stated that a hearing was to have been held for Michael Akers on yesterday; that a letter was received from his attorney asking for a continuance indicating that the charges against him were to have been tried on June 8 but was postponed. He stated it is his thought the criminal trial will be sometime this fall, however no date has been set so far. He asked that the matter be taken off the agenda for the time being and put back on when the criminal matter is resolved.

COMMITTEES

Councilman Pierce stated that the Budget and Finance Committee had a meeting today and it was decided all questions have been satisfactorily answered regarding the 2004-2005 proposed budget. He stated that the matter would be placed on next week's agenda.

City Attorney Nelson added that the document would have to be advertised for a ten-day notice prior to the public hearing on second and third reading.

Chairman Benson expressed appreciation for a well-prepared budget presentation.

Councilman Lively stated that the Safety Committee previously scheduled for next Tuesday would not be held pursuant to advice from the City Attorney.

COMMITTEES (Continued)

Councilman Littlefield stated that the Legal and Legislative Committee met today and received a report from Planning Staff regarding their proposed recommendations as to how we might deal with zoning questions on Brainerd Road. He stated there were a number of recommendations, two of which are to refer matters regarding the proposed or prospective historic zoning properties between the Brainerd Tunnel and Rosemont to the Historic Zoning Commission for their review and ask Planning Staff to do a computer search for property owners to give a list of properties affected by that proposal to work from. He stated Planning would be asked to continue their study of ways we might address some of the specific uses of property and some special uses such as the tattoo parlors, check cashing places and other types of special businesses that have been affecting the Brainerd Road area.

At this point Councilman Littlefield made the motion to refer the historic question to the Historic Zoning Commission of properties from the Brainerd Tunnel to Rosemont to review the potential of creating a historic overlay zone in that area; Councilwoman Robinson seconded the motion; the motion carried.

Councilman Littlefield continued by stating that the Legal and Legislative Committee will meet next Tuesday, June 29 at 3 p.m. and indicated that he does not have a specific agenda item.

Chairman Benson stated that the matter of clear cutting could be an issue for discussion. He stated Greg Haynes is ready with that.

Councilman Hakeem stated that an item in **Public Works Committee** today involved a resolution for next week for the Fire Department and their need for an air conditioning system that comes with the a recommendation for approval. He scheduled a **meeting** of the Committee **for Tuesday**, **July 6 at 4 p.m**.

DISTRICT 4 MEETING

Chairman Benson expressed thanks to everyone from Administration for their presence at last week's District 4 meeting. He stated that Mayor Corker, Councilman Littlefield and other elected officials were present and that it was an excellent meeting with 185 who checked in and 200+ in attendance.

ANIMAL CARE TRUST (ACT)

Chairman Benson reported that he is continuing to work with ACT; that they met last Friday and are moving along with the Advisory Committee. He stated that another meeting is scheduled for this Friday at 10 a.m. if any Council members are interested in attending; that they plan to finalize the members who will serve.

LARRY HILLEY

Larry Hilley stated that he owns property at 2600 and 2602 East 44th Street. He stated both are rental properties and he has owned one of them over twenty years and has a tenant in one of the units that has lived there for nineteen years. He stated there are three residences that are real close to his where people are selling crack cocaine; that they come onto his property and steal his air conditioners out of the windows, tearing out the window facing in the process. He stated this has created a lot of problems for him and he has had to put up a six foot fence; that he has told every police officer about this that he has made contact with for the last ten years that they are selling crack. He stated he has called the DEA and FBI and has been to Internal Affairs and does not know what else to do. He stated that he went to a couple neighborhood meetings and because he is a landlord and not owner occupied they viewed him differently. He stated he is trying to do the right thing and is at a loss as to what he can do to get them out of his neighborhood. He asked if the Council could give any suggestions as to the next step.

Chairman Benson informed Mr. Hilley that he had come to the right place; that two people who can be of help to him are present – Chief Cooke of the Police Department and Kenardo Curry, Administrator of Neighborhood Services.

Mr. Hilley stated that he went out to Amnicola Highway and got the "run around".

Councilman Benson stated Chief Cooke would listen to him and for Mr. Hilley to see him (Cooke) at the end of the meeting; that Mr. Curry can assist. He asked that Mr. Hilley give those two a chance.

Councilman Littlefield asked how many years this situation has existed. Mr. Hilley responded that it has been at least ten years.

Councilman Littlefield asked if it involves the same individual. Mr. Hilley responded that two of them are the same and one just moved in.
