Chairman Benson called the meeting of the Chattanooga Council to order with Councilmen Hakeem, Littlefield, Lively, Page, Pierce, Robinson and Taylor present; Councilman Franklin joined the meeting later. City Attorney Randall Nelson, Management Analyst Randy Burns and Council Clerk Carol O'Neal, CMC, were also present.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE/INVOCATION

Following the Pledge of Allegiance, Pastor Overstreet gave invocation.

MINUTE APPROVAL

On motion of Councilwoman Robinson, seconded by Councilman Lively, the minutes of the previous meeting were approved as published and signed in open meeting.

SPECIAL PRESENTATION: RECOGNITION OF LORAYNE DURHAM'S 100TH BIRTHDAY

Councilman Littlefield asked Jim Durham, son of Lorayne Durham, to join him at the lectern. He acknowledged that Mrs. Durham's granddaughter, Katherine, was also present. Councilman Littlefield read from a prepared certificate for Mrs. Durham which stated, "*Mrs. Lorayne Durham was born February 7, 1905 in Anderson, Tennessee. She is descended from one of the First Families of Tennessee, William Anderson and Jane Bryant, who emigrated from Ireland in 1762. Her parents, Victor S. Anderson and Minnie L. Arnold, owned a large farm, Gourd Neck, near Anderson, Tennessee. The family moved to Chattanooga in the early 1900's and Mrs. Durham worked briefly at Western Union where she met and later married Charles L. Durham on July 16, 1926; to this union was born one son, James Ronald. Mr. Durham passed away March 11, 1980. Mrs. Durham was an award winning ceramic artist during her active years and her work can be found in many collections in Tennessee and across the south. Her favorite pastime in her later years has been researching the genealogy of the Anderson Family. Mrs. Durham has been an upstanding and leading member of Chattanooga society for quite some time.*"

Councilman Littlefield indicated that the certificate was signed by Mayor Corker and Jack Benson, Council Chair.

Councilman Littlefield stated this issue was debated vigorously in Committee and approval is recommended. He stated the effort is to once again reassemble diverse elements that deal with various cultures in Chattanooga, including the new Hispanic population, in addition to minorities that were previously covered by various offices.

On motion of Councilman Littlefield, seconded by Councilman Pierce,
A RESOLUTION RECOMMENDING THE ADMINISTRATION SET ASIDE FUNDS IN THE NEXT OPERATING BUDGET FOR AN OFFICE OF MULTICULTURAL AFFAIRS IN AN AMOUNT OF UP TO FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$500,000.00)

was adopted.

**SET ASIDE FUNDS FOR THE REPAIR OF THE WILCOX
BOULEVARD TUNNEL**

Councilman Hakeem stated this item was also discussed in today's Legal and Legislative Committee. He stated it is his belief all see this as something that has "been on the table" for decades and something that needs to be done for the community as a whole for commercial, as well as, residential purposes.

After the vote was taken on the three Resolutions, Councilman Page stated that three Resolutions have been adopted to set aside funds for the Animal Center, establishment of a Multicultural Office and repairs for the Wilcox Tunnel. He expressed his feeling that the Council should give ample opportunity for the new administration coming in to set a budget and participate in development of the budget.

**SET ASIDE FUNDS FOR THE REPAIR OF THE WILCOX

Councilman Page stated that he wanted to emphasize the three recommendations are based upon the City's ability to have funds available. He offered a word of caution as he was nervous of moving forward to do many resolutions with regard to next year's budget, indicating that we have to know what we have before we spend.

Chairman Benson clarified that all three Resolutions are not alike. He stated Mesdames Wilson, Brown, Deweese and Kruesi are coming forward with private matching monies and there is an incentive in that one and the amount cannot be exceeded.

In acknowledging Councilman Page's concern, Councilman Littlefield stated the other two Resolutions simply are recommendations and it is his thought they would be taken as a suggestion to the new administration. He stated administration has a responsibility to come back with a balanced budget and if they are not able to fund the requests it would be up to administration to explain why or why not. He stated the new administration will present their organizational structure which is subject to Council action.

Councilman Hakeem stated all three would have to be reviewed by the incoming administration, no more or less, one than the other.

ZONING STUDY

2004-231: City of Chattanooga

Pursuant to notice of public hearing, the request of the City of Chattanooga to rezone properties within the East Chattanooga neighborhood area came on to be heard.

There was no opposition was in attendance.

ZONING STUDY (Continued)

Jerry Pace, Operations Director with the Regional Planning Agency (RPA), stated that this zoning adjustment is the study the Council requested Planning conduct. He stated the recommendation is for approval of rezoning properties listed in the legal section. He stated there are several properties excluded which did not appear in the legal description.

Councilman Taylor stated that he wanted to make sure there are no discrepancies; that we have taken care of getting mail outs to everyone.

Mr. Pace stated in this instance the East Chattanooga study was addressed through the Council office for advertisement. He stated the Rossville study was to be on the agenda this evening, however due to insufficient funding it is being delayed until funding can be arranged. He stated the Rossville area has a moratorium on construction of duplexes that expires February 15; that it would need to be extended until the study is complete or reviewed.

Councilman Taylor inquired as to the immediate availability of funding.

Mr. Pace again reiterated that this is being addressed through the Council office. He stated Councilman Hakeem addressed the East Chattanooga plan, yet there was no funding for the Rossville plan and (it) was not placed on the agenda. He stated RPA does not have available monies for advertising the plan in their budget. He stated a \$50 fee is collected for advertising at the time an applicant applies, however the advertising is a very small notice and is usually under the \$50 amount. He stated the request for the rezoning study was made from the Council and the fee for advertising each of the plans is in excess of \$2,000, which RPA does not have; that advertisement of both plans would have been in excess of \$5,000.

Councilman Hakeem "called for the question".

Councilman Littlefield stated that he is very interested in the Rossville Boulevard area and it is his hope we would try to find funds to get it done quickly.

Councilman Taylor stated that there are residents who have worked untiringly with the plan and want to recognize the importance of bringing that forward and moving it ahead.

Councilman Pierce "called for the question" at this time.

HEARING: CHRISTINE WARREN

The hearing for Christine Warren was rescheduled for Wednesday, March 16 beginning at 9 a.m. with Councilmen Page, Pierce and Benson serving as the panel; Councilman Lively volunteered as alternate. **It was noted that Ms. Warren’s hearing would be held in the Council Conference Room** as the Assembly Room is scheduled for another meeting.

HEARING: DANIEL GIBBS

The hearing for Daniel Gibbs was rescheduled for April 4 beginning at 9 a.m. with Councilmen Robinson, Pierce and Benson serving as the panel; Councilman Page volunteered as alternate.

HEARING: SABRINA SMITH

Councilman Lively stated a personnel hearing for Sabrina Smith on yesterday. He stated Mrs. Smith was terminated because she had moved out of the state and the *City Charter* requires employees to be registered to vote in Tennessee. He stated the Committee had no alternative but to uphold the City's recommendation for termination.

CITY ELECTIONS AND CANCELLATION OF MARCH 1 COUNCIL MEETING

City Attorney Nelson stated that he presumed the Council would not have a meeting on March 1 due to conflict of elections.

On motion of Councilwoman Robinson, seconded by Councilman Taylor, the March 1, 2005 Council meeting was cancelled.

City Attorney Nelson stated if there is a runoff it would be held on April 12, which is likewise a Tuesday. He indicated that the Council should not attempt to pass ordinances on second reading by two different Councils and suggested that all ordinances would have to be in by April 5. He stated if there is not going to be a meeting on April 12 we would have to wait and see who would be involved in the runoffs and possibly go back another week regarding the ordinances. He stated right now there would be no meeting on March 1 and any ordinance with two readings will have to be in by April 5.

RECOGNITION OF STUDENTS

Chairman Benson recognized the presence of students from Southern Adventist University.

ST. ELMO RECREATION CENTER

Councilman Taylor motioned the Council for support to put a moratorium in place on any demolition of the St. Elmo Recreation Center for 120 days; Councilman Pierce seconded the motion.

Councilman Pierce stated that the Center is already scheduled for demolition and he wants to put a "freeze" on it to stop activity for 120 days.

City Attorney Nelson stated the motion could be overcome by another motion.

At this point the vote was taken and the motion carried.

ROSSVILLE BOULEVARD AREA MORATORIUM

Councilman Taylor stated we now have a moratorium in place on duplex construction while waiting for the Rossville Plan to take place. He **made the motion to extend the moratorium an additional 90 days; Councilwoman Robinson seconded the motion.**

Mr. Pace stated the moratorium limits those properties within the downzoning recommendation.

Councilman Pierce asked for clarification of the property that is to come before the Variance Board on tomorrow, indicating there is something strange with regard to switching properties that he does not understand.

Mr. Pace stated that the applicant is trying to switch the property they have a permit on. He stated he does not believe the Variance Board will allow them to switch properties, but the applicant is also asking for a variance on the lot size. He stated they could act on the lot size variance, but the moratorium is in building permits on those lots, so he was not sure what action the Board might take. He stated action may be deferred until the study is complete.

Councilman Pierce stated if the variance is granted tomorrow, the applicant already has one permit and the study would pass as is. He asked what happens to the permit the applicant has now.

Mr. Pace stated as he understands it, if the applicant has been given a permit already that was prior to the study he would probably be able to go ahead and continue his work on that; that he probably went ahead with construction without the study being complete if the permit was issued. He stated the moratorium is only on new permits being issued for construction.

At this point the vote was taken on the motion to extend the moratorium an additional 90 days and the motion carried.

EXECUTIVE SUMMIT COMMITTEE

Councilman Pierce invited all Council members to attend the Executive Summit Committee meeting of the African American Summit to hear an update. He stated the Committee has talked with the leading Mayoral candidates and would like to inform the Council of all that is being planned. He stated the informational meeting would be held on Monday, February 14 beginning at 9 a.m. in the Council Conference Room.
