City Council Building Chattanooga, Tennessee July 26, 2005 6:00 p.m.

Chairman Robinson called the meeting of the Chattanooga Council to order with Councilman Bennett, Benson, Franklin, Hakeem, Pierce, Rico and Rutherford present; Councilman Page was absent due to personal commitment. City Attorney Randall Nelson, Management Analyst Randy Burns and Council Clerk Carol O'Neal, CMC, were also present.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE/INVOCATION

Following the Pledge of Allegiance, Councilman Hakeem called upon Rev. Gary Steel of the Lookout Valley Baptist Church to give invocation and asked that everyone remember the families of Councilman Page and Commission Cotton in the loss of their mothers.

MINUTE APPROVAL

On motion of Councilwoman Rutherford, seconded by Councilman Rico, the minutes of the previous meeting were approved as published and signed in open meeting.

<u>SPECIAL PRESENTATION: VANESSA JACKSON –</u> WORLD CHANGERS

Vanessa Jackson, Program Manager with Neighborhood Services, expressed thanks for the opportunity to address the Council and noted for two consecutive years World Changers has come to our city and made a lasting impact upon neighborhoods and families by repairing homes for senior citizens and other deserving residents. She stated this year World Changers has been here since July 16 and will remain through July 30; that there are 700 youth and adult volunteers doing carpentry, painting and roofing in the neighborhoods of the Alton Park, Clifton Hills and Oak Grove communities. She stated in addition to World Changers, others who have partnered with Neighborhood Services are present and asked them to stand: Hamilton County Baptist Association, Community Impact Fund represented by Gary Rudolph and the Front Porch Alliance.

At this time Ms. Jackson introduced Mark Horner, Construction Coordinator for the project, and referenced the project repair list distributed to each Council member.

<u>SPECIAL PRESENTATION: VANESSA JACKSON – WORLD CHANGERS</u>

Mark Horner expressed thanks to the city of Chattanooga for partnering with them and allowing them to go into the neighborhoods. He stated it has been a great two weeks as they have worked on 60 homes, that several residents were touched and the Lord made a difference in their lives. He stated this is a "winwin" program for the city, for neighborhoods and youth that work with World Changers. He expressed thanks to Ms. Jackson and staff for working with them, noting that they have been working on this since February or March as a six month start-up is required for homes selection. He stated the Neighborhood Services Department has been very supportive of them and it is his hope the good partnership will carry on in years to come.

Councilman Hakeem came forward at this time and presented Mr. Horner with a proclamation signed by Mayor Littlefield and Council Chairman Robinson proclaiming the weeks of July 16-30 as "World Changers Home Repair Weeks". In presenting the proclamation and lapel pins, he stated that his experience with World Changers has been what he has seen; that people from all walks of life have been served well by this program. He stated of the partnerships often spoke of in Chattanooga this is the reality of what is being done in neighborhoods. He stated some may have a problem with faith based organizations giving service of this nature, but our communities have been fortunate and blessed to have people willing to give of themselves. He stated the new administrator of Neighborhood Services, Beverly Johnson, has been very instrumental in making sure this program followed through. He expressed thanks to Mr. Horner and others with him and noted that in reality they have changed Chattanooga and it will never be the same again!

Chairman Robinson thanked the World Changers for changing the world; that so many people are much better off tonight because of them!

Councilman Hakeem reminded Council members of the **Public Works Committee meeting scheduled for Tuesday, August 2 at 4 p.m.** He stated that an update on the City Hall renovations and an update on the task force in regard to business diversity would be discussed, as well as other items.

Councilwoman Rutherford scheduled a meeting of the **Safety Committee for Tuesday**, **August 2 at 3:30 p.m**.

In the absence of Councilman Page, Chairman Robinson stated the tax rate has been set and scheduled a **Budget and Finance Committee meeting for Tuesday**, **August 2 to be held jointly with the Legal and Legislative Committee meeting beginning at 3 p.m**.

ATTORNEY WALTER WILLIAMS

Former City Court Judge Walter Williams informed the Council of the passing of a distinguished citizen, William Holmberg. He stated the newspaper indicated that he lived on Elder Mountain, but he was a citizen of Chattanooga. He stated during the invocation there was mention of the Page and Cotton families and asked that the Council keep the Holmberg family in their prayers, as well. He stated the funeral service will be held on Friday at 11 a.m. at the Mizpah Synagogue with a reception following at the Chattanoogan. He stated all are saddened by his passing as he was a distinguished person and a good citizen of this community.

Chairman Robinson spoke on behalf of the Council in expressing sympathy to the Holmberg family.

JERRY MCQUEEN

Jerry McQueen, who stated she is also known as "Jerry Springer", indicated that she came twenty years ago to say the same thing she is saying tonight. He stated that she is head of the Peace Officers of the World and her partner is Bryant Sims, an attorney in West Palm Beach in Palm Beach Florida. She stated that she offered to work with the city and community during the time of the Wadie Suttles matter when there was such an uproar but it seemed others had taken over. She stated she continues to come to the Council and continues to sit and watch the Council "in the dark". She stated she has now waited long enough and it has been twenty years; that the reason the peace officers are not with her tonight is that they had some last minute business to take care of. She concluded her comments by stating that this is all she wanted the Council to know.

GARY BALL

Gary Ball was present representing Ridgedale and noted that he distributed educational information and wanted to come before the Council for a few minutes to speak about the police department. He stated his area in Sector 2 has had an ongoing community-police interaction committee since 1999 and includes everything in Echo 1-9 police districts. He stated they had been meeting at the police service center and after 9-11 they did not want them to meet there anymore; that at the end of the six years they have not been perfect meetings each time and they have not always been happy nor have the police been happy. He stated several have "stuck it out" to keep the dialogue open. He noted there is always competition in thinking "this group" or "that group" gets more from the police if they yell or scream louder, but he wanted the Council to know his area is the only sector out of three that can claim this; that all the other groups disbanded once the police department received accreditation.

Mr. Ball continued by stating his group includes East Chattanooga, Avondale, Glenwood, Bushtown, Highland Park, Ridgedale, Oak Grove, Cedar Hill, East Lake, Clifton Hills and Ft. Cheatham. He stated over the years people on the Fox Team have been the ones religiously attending the meetings from the police department and the department renewed their effort in February of this year. He stated Captain Hixson, who is over Sector 2, sent a letter to all neighborhoods in the sector and attends each meeting, which is held the second Tuesday of each month. He stated he wanted the Council to know this if they were not aware; that they realize the police department is not perfect but are still communicating with neighborhoods.

LOUISE HAMMONDS

Louise Hammonds of the Oak Grove community added to Mr. Ball's comments by stating that they have open communication with the police department within her community. She stated a lot of people say their community is the worst one; however they think they have a good community and have been working with the police department for the last six years. She stated she has seen the community clean up a lot and invited other communities to come to their meetings; that they would love to have everyone join in and work together as the police are working well with them.

LOUISE HAMMONDS (Continued)

Mrs. Hammonds stated that the World Changers came into her community two years ago and expressed thanks to Admin. Johnson who worked hard on this. She sated that many lives have been touched in her community by persons who felt they could never get their house repaired. She stated one person whose home was repaired sat on the front porch crying because she did not think she would ever get her house repaired. She stated the World Changers have really touched lives and she is proud of everyone in Chattanooga who made this possible.

Chairman Robinson stated Ms. Hammonds' comments are wonderful to hear and all on the Council join her in expressing thanks to the World Changers and the police for all they are doing.

Chairman Robinson adjourned the meeting of the Chattanooga Council until Tuesday, August 2, 2005 at 6:00 p.m.
