CITY COUNCIL BUILDING OCTOBER 21, 2008 6:00 P.M.

Chairman Bennett called the meeting of the Chattanooga City Council to order with Councilmen Benson, Berz, Gaines, Pierce, Rico, Robinson, and Shockley present. Councilman Page was absent due to personal commitment. City Attorney Randall Nelson; Management Analyst Randy Burns; and Shirley Crownover, Assistant Clerk to the Council, were also present.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE/INVOCATION

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Councilwoman Robinson, followed by invocation.

MINUTE APPROVAL

On motion of Councilman Rico, seconded by Councilman Pierce, the minutes of the previous meeting were approved as published and signed in open meeting.

MARSHALL FELLOWS/ ELEANOR COOPER

Chairman Bennett called on Ms. Eleanor Cooper to come to the podium to tell us about this group.

Ms. Cooper stated that the group present tonight was the Marshall Fellows from Europe. She explained that this was a Transatlantic Program between the USA and the Atlantic. She stated that she would like for them to introduce themselves, noting that we had been doing this for ten years. She added that she felt that this would give us a presence in Europe.

The first speaker was **Gerardo Del Caz Esteso of Spain.** He thanked everyone, stating that this was a program represented by Madrid to learn more about the USA. He stated that he was impressed with Chattanooga and the changes that have been made in the last 20 years—being a grassroots movement. He stated that he was happy to be here.

MARSHALL FELLOWS CONT'D:

The next speaker was **Ms. Denisa Sarajlic-Maglic of Bosnia.** She, too, thanked the Council for having them here, stating that she was impressed with the City and was afraid that Chattanooga had spoiled them for the five more cities that they were to visit.

Next to approach the podium was **Ms. Anna Libak of Denmark.** She is the Current Affairs Editor at the Danish weekly *Weekendavisen* in Copenhagen. She thanked the Council for having them.

The next speaker was **Krassimir Popov of Bulgaria**. He stated that he worked for a private investment company. He stated that it was an honor to be here and thanked everyone for their hospitality, stating that this was a very strong community.

Rene Kubasek of the Czech Republic was the next speaker. He joined his colleagues in saying that he was impressed with Chattanooga, stating that this was the first American city that he had visited.

Huseyin Ural Akuzum of Istanbul, Turkey came next to the podium. He also thanked the Council for having them, stating that he was an Attorney at Law. He again expressed his thanks.

Ms. Wiebke Kupper of Germany was next. She stated that she was an architect and city planner, stating that Chattanooga was a very attractive city and thanking the Council.

Chairman Bennett stated that Chattanooga was becoming a Global Market place, noting that we were fortunate to have such smart young people visiting us.

Councilwoman Robinson thanked Eleanor Cooper for all the work that she does with these international endeavors; that we need to be reminded that we are a learning headquarters for a great German corporation (VW); that Eleanor has worked tirelessly with our Sister Cities Program. She went on to say that she and Chairman Bennett went to Greenville, South Carolina last week and learned about their efforts to strengthen their international community; that they came back with the determination that they would do the same thing for our city.

MARSHALL FELLOWS (CONT'D)

Councilwoman Berz stated that she, too, thanked Ms. Cooper, stating that she had had the pleasure of working with this group—that they were a very, very bright young group and an asset to our community. She stated that it was her pleasure to welcome them here and again thanked Eleanor Cooper.

JOHN TAYLOR OMA DIRECTOR INTRO.

Chairman Bennett welcomed former Councilman John Taylor to the meeting to make a presentation.

Mr. Taylor came to the podium and asked that OMA Committee members join him, as well. He wished everyone a good evening and thanked the Council for this opportunity. He stated that it felt so good to be standing here, and he thanked Councilmembers for the great job they were doing on a daily basis. He went on to say that OMA was appreciative of their support to their organization, which was working to make Chattanooga inclusive, stating that Chattanooga was like a quilted blanket.

Mr. Taylor stated that they were here today because they had lost Jacqueline Strong Moss as their director and had been engaged in an active process to find an outstanding individual to carry on the work of this office and carry it to greater heights. He thanked Dr. Medley for the outstanding work that she had done in the interim, stating that she had been here for a few weeks. He turned the meeting over to Dr. Medley.

Dr. Medley brought greetings to the Council and thanked them, stating that she appreciated the Council's support of OMA and that she had enjoyed each of her different roles and tasks. She stated that it had been quite an interesting month's work to maintain this office and their exceptional staff. She went on to say that she was pleased to be part of the Search Committee for a new director—that they had presented their choices to the Mayor, and he had made an excellent choice; that they were very pleased and were here tonight to introduce the new director to the Council. She went on to say that there were higher heights to strive for and that this individual was well-equipped to carry out this work; that they had some folders provided with information for the Council; that member of the Board were here as well, and she turned the meeting over to Chairman Alan Richelson.

OMA DIRECTOR(CONT'D)

Mr. Richelson stated that he had chaired the committee to search for the new director in conjunction with the City's Personnel Department. At this time he introduced the new director, Beverly Cosley.

Ms. Cosley stated that she was really happy to be standing here and back again with the City of Chattanooga; that it was a pleasure for her to serve in this capacity—that she had a long-time standing with such projects. She noted that most might remember her as the former Outreach Director with the Chattanooga Police Dept. under Chief Dotson. She went on to say that the position of OMA Director was quite a natural fit for her; that she had started her career as a school teacher, had been in Real Estate, then Housing, and had also been at Chattanooga State—that she had gone through these other vocations and was well pleased to bring these experiences to her new position and would work with the Council and the Board and also the OMA Staff that was in place. She thanked the Council for this opportunity.

Mr. Taylor stated that they were excited about the new director and appreciated the Council's position and support.

Councilman Pierce thanked Mr. Taylor and Ms. Cosley, stating that he would put in place a motion to accept this recommendation. This was seconded by Councilwoman Robinson.

Councilwoman Berz stated to Ms. Cosley that she wanted to be the one to second this motion. She stated "girlfriend" a lot of us have been good friends and welcome, welcome, welcome and thank you for being willing to serve. She added that the Selection Committee had "done good"!

Chairman Bennett added her congratulations to the new Director of OMA.

AMEND CITY CODE TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT

Councilman Benson thanked each and every one for the work on this that had been going on for 6-8 weeks; that this had been a learning experience for a lot of us; that we were changing the title of the Ordinance from the Wrecker Ordinance to Traffic Incident Management Service Ordinance.

TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT (CONT'D)

Councilman Benson explained that we wanted this to be more than just a Wrecker Ordinance but to include traffic management incidents on the Interstate. He stated that we would be coming into the days of Volkswagen and needed to be prepared for a lot of traffic and needed to be able to clear our Interstate quickly and safely and to move traffic. He went on to say that he believed we were bringing an Ordinance tonight that might still need some changing, but we needed to know what the future holds. He added that right now the industry is segmented and diverse and to make all happy is totally impossible; that we believed that this Traffic Incident Management Service Ordinance was probably better than the one we had known as the Wrecker Ordinance. He noted that this was a compromise, but he felt we could live with this and see if it works and can change it if needed in two weeks' time. He emphasized that this could be changed later if needed.

He went on to urge Ms. Wandell to let us know their experiences because this Ordinance is subject to change.

MARK BENNETT

Mark Bennett, also of Mostellers, wanted to know when the Recovery Class comes into effect? He mentioned a \$8,000 charge if they had to "winch". He also wanted to know who would call Class "C" for recovery?

Attorney Nelson responded that the one making the call would be the Police Officer at the scene who would be making the decision.

Mr. Bennett again mentioned that the charge could be \$8,000.

Attorney Nelson reiterated that the one in charge at the scene would determine the equipment needed.

MARK BENNETT (CONT'D)

Vice Chairman Benson noted that there would be rationale for making the decision and we also had to put some training into place.

Mr. Bennett asked if the Recovery Class had to be justified?

Vice Chairman Benson responded "yes"—or otherwise the next on the list would be called, and they would be given 90 minutes to get the job done.

ADJOURNMENT

Vice Chairman Benson adjourned the meeting of the Chattanooga City Council until Tuesday, October 28, 2008, at 6:00 P.M.
