City Council Building Chattanooga, Tennessee November 16, 2010

Chairman Rico called the meeting of the Chattanooga City Council to order with Councilmen Benson, Berz, Gilbert, Ladd, McGary, Murphy, Robinson and Scott present. City Attorney Phil Noblett; Management Analyst Randy Burns; and Shirley Crownover, Assistant Clerk to the Council, were also present.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE/ INVOCATION

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Chairman Rico, followed by invocation.

MINUTE APPROVAL

On motion of Councilman McGary, seconded by Councilman Murphy, the minutes of the previous meeting were approved as published with one correction. Councilman Gilbert noted that he was the one that voted "No" on the Highland Park Commons Closure and Abandonment rather than Councilman Murphy.

SPECIAL GUEST/BOB EDWARDS

Chairman Rico noted that we had a special guest with us tonight—Mr. Bob Edwards, who as present on the behalf of the Sister Cities Association.

Mr. Edwards introduced Ms. Jun Duan, who is with the Embassy of the People's Republic of China out of Washington, D.C.. He stated that Dr. Swansboro of UTC had taken the initiative of getting someone from the Embassy to Chattanooga and that Ms. Duan had taken on the responsibility. He asked her to say a few words.

Ms. Duan wished Chairman Rico and the rest of the Council a good evening, stating that it was an honor and pleasure for her to be here, and she thanked everyone for inviting her. She stated that she would like to pass on a message of greetings to the Council—that China's relationship with local governments and the Sister Cities Association is very important; that she appreciated very much the tremendous work and efforts that had been made in relation to Wuxi and the understanding of China and its people; that they would continue to work with Chattanooga with any support they could. She again thanked the Council.

BOB EDWARDS (CONT'D)

Councilwoman Robinson stated that she would like to add her voice as a special welcome and express her appreciation for the time that she spent in Wuxi; that this was a very special time to her and that Mr. Edwards was a wonderful guide. She encouraged Ms. Duan to visit the Peace Grove in honor of Wuxi and thanked her for being here, asking her to give our regards to the Embassy.

Chairman Rico stated to Ms. Duan that she was always welcome in Chattanooga.

TENNESSEE, OWNED BY OBAR INVESTMENTS, LLC BEING MORE FULLY DESCRIBED HEREIN

passed first reading with Councilman Gilbert voting "no".

Attorney Noblett noted that a Public Hearing was needed on this case—that a small part was left out of the original annexation. He called on Attorney Bobo.

Mr. Bobo stated that this was a "friendly" annexation and that he would be brief. He went over the project time line—Public Hearing on November 16th, which is now being held; First Reading next Tuesday (November 23rd); Second and final reading on November 30th; Official Annexation date will be December 30th. A map was provided to show the parcel that is being discussed. He stated that Adm. Leach was present, also, to answer questions.

Mr. Leach explained that this is a three-acre site—that it is not large and is split by the City and County; that the owner wished to develop a PUD, and he would go through the Plan of Services based on the completion of the PUD—that Traffic Engineering is first and that all the signage will be developed by the developer; refuse will be collected and there will be routine maintenance after the development is completed. Street signs and lighting will be provided by the developer. He explained that the sewer system is in somewhat of a quandary as to whether it will be the WWTA or us. Normal inspection services will occur during development.

ANNEXATION (CONT'D):

Chief Parker stated that there were no problems in so far as the Fire Dept. was concerned, noting that a new fire station is being built in the Tiftonia area that will service this property. He noted that there were no buildings on the land; that they would do an inspection but there were presently no problems. He also spoke for the basic Plan of Services for the Police Dept., stating that they would not incur any additional costs.

Mr. Bobo asked that the property owner be allowed to speak. He came forward, stating that he did not wish to speak but was here to answer any questions; that this is a contiguous piece of land that is completely undeveloped.

Councilwoman Scott stated that she would like for the City Attorney to address the WWTA problem that was mentioned in that the WWTA had not ceded this; that she needed some clarification; that she thought the WWTA had ceded everything in the growth boundaries.

Attorney Noblett stated that he had not seen such an agreement; that any annexed area is allowed time for ceding, which is normally a time period of 30 days; that as yet we had not received an answer from WWTA. Councilwoman Scott asked if we had received an answer on other annexations? Attorney Noblett stated that this was a discussion that Attorney McMahan had, and he was not sure about all of the annexations.
