COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

August 26, 2014 6:00 PM

CALL TO ORDER

Council Chairman Chip Henderson called the meeting to order with Vice Chair Dr. Carol Berz and Councilpersons Chris Anderson, Moses Freeman, Russell Gilbert, Larry Grohn, Yusuf Hakeem, Jerry Mitchell and Ken Smith all present. City Attorney Wade Hinton, Management Analyst Randy Burns and Deputy Clerk Nicole Gwyn, CMC, were also present.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Vice Chair Dr. Berz led the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL OF LAST MINUTES

On motion of Councilman Mitchell and seconded by Councilman Gilbert, the minutes of the last meeting (August 19, 2014) were approved as published.

ORDINANCES - FINAL READING:

On motion of Councilman Hakeem and seconded by Councilman Mitchell.

ORDINANCE #12850

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHATTANOOGA CITY CODE, PART II, CHAPTER 25, ARTICLE III, SECTIONS 25-67, 25-69, 25-73, 25-75, 25-76, AND 25-77 RELATIVE TO UNLAWFUL NOISES SO AS TO CREATE DOWNTOWN AMPLIFIED MUSIC DISTRICT.

A discussion ensued about Section 25-73 and 25-69. Councilman Grohn voiced concerns about Section 25-69, where it references "the measuring at the property line of the business producing the sound averaged over one (1) minute." He wanted to add language regarding a maximum time. Councilman Anderson called a *Point of Order*, seeking clarification on whether the City Attorney was being asked to make a policy amendment to the bill. Chairman Henderson clarified by restating the amendment that Councilman Grohn was proposing. Further discussion endued, wherein Councilman Grohn withdrew his proposal for an amendment.

A discussion took place with Chief Operating Officer Brent Goldberg, who responded to the material costs associated with enforcement of the ordinance. Vice Chair Dr. Berz recommended reviewing the ordinance in six (6) months rather than a year. Attorney Hinton clarified that any member of Council could introduce an amendment to this ordinance at any time.
