#### **OTHER BUSINESS:**

## Senate Bill 0123

Councilman Anderson updated the Council on Senate Bill 0123, which would have prohibited local governments from entering into collective bargaining agreements with labor unions or employee associations. He informed the Council that the bill was now dead in the Tennessee General Assembly, having been defeated in a 9-0 vote.

## **City Attorney's Report**

Attorney Hinton yielded to Tom Greenholtz, an attorney with Chambliss, Bahner and Stophel. Attorney Greenholtz informed the Council of a mediation that took place last week, resulting in an agreed upon settlement against the City for \$75,000 and Hamilton County for \$75,000. He asked the Council for a resolution, subject to City and County approval, with a release of all claims against both government bodies and with both government bodies handling their own costs.

**Councilman Anderson moved** approval, seconded by Councilman Mitchell. Attorney Hinton objected and asked the Council to "authorize the City Attorney to execute the settlement agreement." **Councilman Anderson moved**, seconded by Councilman Mitchell. The motion carried.

## **COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

Chairman Henderson led a discussion to commit the stormwater ordinance to the Public Works Committee for revisions to the tree clear-cutting language within that ordinance. There will be a meeting of the Public Works Committee next week following Agenda regarding the tree clear-cutting language in the stormwater ordinance.

Economic and Community Development Committee Councilman Anderson

- He looked forward to having another discussion with an expanded panel in the next couple of months.

- The committee met today to discuss items to cover items that would appear on first reading next week (April 14).
- The committee had an educational session last week regarding the Board of Zoning Appeal ("Variance Board") and that everything was satisfactory with it at this time.

Public Works and Transportation Committee Councilman Smith

 The committee will have a special meeting next week after Agenda Session to discuss the tree canopy requirement in the current stormwater ordinance.

Youth and Family Development Committee Councilman Gilbert (No report)

# RECOGNITION OF PERSONS WISHING TO ADDRESS COUNCIL (Non-Agenda Items)

Chairman Henderson stated that there was a group in the Assembly that wished to address the Council on the proposed River Oaks subdivision. Councilman Mitchell asked to suspend the 3-minute limit for Dr. Joe Cofer, who would speak on behalf of various neighborhood associations on a planning case in his district. **Councilman Mitchell moved** to suspend the rules of procedure to allow Dr. Joe Cofer to speak beyond 3 minutes. Councilman Freeman seconded. There were no objections.

Therefore, Chairman Henderson authorized suspending the rules of procedure regarding the 3-minute limit for Dr. Cofer's presentation only. Chairman Henderson then instructed Attorney Hinton to read the rules of procedure for those persons wishing to address the Council on non-agenda items. After which, Chairman Henderson recognized Dr. Cofer, who addressed the Council with the aid of a visual presentation.

Dr. Cofer stated that he represented three (3) neighborhood groups: River Knoll Property Owners Association, Stuart Heights Neighborhood Association and Old Towne Homeowners Association. He stated that the group opposed the proposed new River Summit Drive from a public safety standpoint and detailed their concerns. Chairman Henderson noted that the developer of the subdivision was not present during Dr. Cofer's presentation.

A discussion ensued with John Bridger of Regional Planning about an independent study by the City of Chattanooga regarding this area. Mr. Bridger stated that he would coordinate communications with the community on the study.

Chairman Henderson also recognized the following individual wishing to address the Council on non-agenda matters:

- Lorraine Piercy (Braley Place) She reiterated Dr. Cofer's concerns about safety at the intersection created by the proposed new River Summit Drive.
  - Further discussion ensued with Mr. Bridger about the process for the upcoming study. Blythe Bailey, Transportation Administrator, also joined the discussion.
  - O Councilman Mitchell asked Mr. Bridger for an addition to the scope of work in the study's Request for Proposal: that the leadership of the community groups meet with the Consultant chosen for the RFP. Mr. Bridger said that could be added, but the Applicant would also need to have "equal face time" with the consultant for the sake of parity.
