#### **COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES**

November 24, 2015 6:00 PM

#### CALL TO ORDER

Council Chairwoman Carol Berz called the meeting to order with Vice Chair Moses Freeman and Council members Chris Anderson, Russell Gilbert, Larry Grohn, Yusuf Hakeem, Chip Henderson, Jerry Mitchell and Ken Smith all present. City Attorney Wade Hinton and Council Clerk Nicole Gwyn, CMC, were also present.

# RECOGNITION OF PERSONS WISHING TO ADDRESS COUNCIL (Non-Agenda Items)

Attorney Hinton read the rules of procedure for persons wishing to address the Council on non-agenda items. After which, Chairwoman Berz recognized the following persons:

- Adam Pressley (Ham. Cty. 4H) He works with the Saddlehouse Riding Club and wanted to follow-up on an email he sent last Friday to the Council regarding the benefits of horse trails. He noted his support of horse trails because it will help youth with disabilities.
- **Dr. Elenora Woods** and **Worbit Lowery (NAACP)** She thanked the Council for the legislation proposed today regarding the "Ban The Box" Initiative. She wanted more clarification on whether or not the proposed legislation about an applicant's conviction history would be removed from the City's job application. Mr. Lowery discussed the Ban The Box Initiative.
  - Councilman Hakeem clarified that the question would be removed from City applications, but there would still be background checks.

- **Stroud Martin (Market St.)** He would like more dialogue with Regional Planning regarding the Cowart Street rezoning coming to the Council agenda soon.
- **Lloyd Longnion (Chattanooga)** He gave three points of fear about the rezoning in the downtown/Southside area and hopes to "move from fear to hope." He asked the City to be do more to notify residents of developments in his neighborhood.
- **Joanne Mitchell (Tennessee Greenway)** She supports the City partnering with the County on horse trails and asks the City to accept the TDEC funding agreement. She also brought copies of the *Tennessee Equine Trail Guide* for councilpersons.
- Robert Ledford (SEIU) He wished the Council a Happy Thanksgiving from the SEIU Local 205.
- **Helen Burns Sharp (Walnut St.)** She hopes there will be more dialogue and community development on zoning at Cowart Street and downtown.
- **Garnet Chapin (Chattanooga)** He asked the Council for more dialogue on the Cowart Street rezoning.
- Cynthia Watson (Market St.) She stated that 80-percent of the residents living in her community were aware of the Cowart Street rezoning. She asked that others opposed to the rezoning would attend the Council meeting next week to voice their concerns.
