COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

March 15, 2016 6:00 PM

CALL TO ORDER

Council Chairwoman Carol Berz called the meeting to order with Vice Chair Moses Freeman and Council members Chris Anderson, Russell Gilbert, Larry Grohn, Yusuf Hakeem, Chip Henderson, Jerry Mitchell and Ken Smith all present. City Attorney Wade Hinton and Council Clerk Nicole Gwyn, CMC, were also present.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Councilman Smith led the Assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance. He then invited Lurone Jennings, Youth and Family Development Administrator, to give the invocation.

APPROVAL OF LAST MINUTES

On motion of Councilman Anderson and seconded by Councilman Gilbert, the minutes of the last meeting (March 8, 2016) were approved as published.

SPECIAL PRESENTATION

Mayor's Council on Women - Leadership Committee

Chairwoman Berz introduced the Leadership Committee's chair, Robin Derryberry to discuss the committee's three areas of work. She read the names of all committee members. Those in attendance introduced themselves to the Council:
