CALL TO ORDER

Council Chairman Moses Freeman called the meeting to order. A quorum was present, including Vice Chair Jerry Mitchell and Council members Chris Anderson, Carol Berz, Russell Gilbert, Yusuf Hakeem, Chip Henderson, Larry Grohn, and Ken Smith all present. Deputy City Attorney Wade Hinton and Council Clerk Nicole Gwyn, CMC, were also present.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Councilwoman Berz led the Assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL OF LAST MINUTES

On motion of Councilman Anderson and seconded by Councilman Gilbert, the minutes of the last meeting (August 2, 2016) were approved as published.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHATTANOOGA CITY CODE, PART II, CHAPTER 38, ZONING ORDINANCE, SO AS TO REZONE PROPERTY LOCATED AT 7127 IGOU GAP ROAD, MORE PARTICULARLY DESCRIBED HEREIN, FROM R-1 RESIDENTIAL ZONE TO R-4 SPECIAL ZONE, SUBJECT TO CERTAIN CONDITIONS.

Councilman Grohn informed the Council that three (3) new conditions had been worked out with the developer and the neighborhood that would replace the current conditions #5, #6 and #7. The Clerk read the new conditions into the record as follows:

5. Along Igou Gap Road there shall be a thirty (30') foot vegetative buffer with an earthen berm varying in height, with a maximum height of six (6') feet and maximum side slopes of 2-1/2:1.

5:1. Said earthen berm toe of slope shall begin five (5') off the right of way of Igou Gap Road. Two staggered rows of evergreen shrubs shall be planted at ten (10') feet centers with a

minimum height of five (5') feet at the time of planting and a required minimum mature height of twelve (12') feet. The two rows shall be set eight (8') feet apart.

6. Along the eastern boundary of the property, where abutting R-1 single family zoning, there shall be a City Standard Type B, City of Chattanooga landscape buffer, twenty (20') wide.

Councilman Grohn moved to approve the amendments, seconded by Councilman Smith. The motion carried. **Councilman Grohn moved** to approve the amended ordinance, seconded by Councilman Mitchell. The motion carried. Attorney Hinton informed the Council that the amended ordinance reverts back to first reading because of the changes to the conditions.

AGENDA ITEM VII(c):

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHATTANOOGA CITY CODE, PART II, CHAPTER 38, ZONING ORDINANCE, SO AS TO REZONE PART OF PROPERTY LOCATED AT 1335 O'GRADY DRIVE, MORE PARTICULARLY DESCRIBED HEREIN, FROM R-1 RESIDENTIAL ZONE TO R-3 RESIDENTIAL ZONE, SUBJECT TO CERTAIN CONDITIONS.

A hearing ensued, with John Bridger (Regional Planning) making a visual presentation on this item. After which, Attorney Hinton read the rules of procedure for speakers addressing the Council. Chairman Freeman then recognized the following Applicant:

- **Rebecca Little (Thompson St.)** – She discussed her family's efforts since May 2015 regarding this request. She stated that she feels like a victim of hypothetical legislation not yet passed. She stated that her only vehicle for a short-term vacation rental is requesting rezoning and limiting the use of R-3 to short term vacation rental. She also addressed several concerns she had heard from neighbors.

On behalf of the Opposition:

- **James Fox (Old Bird Drive)** – He distributed a list of signatures from neighborhood homeowners who opposed this rezoning. He believes that R-3 zoning would not be conducive to the neighborhood.
- **Curtis Buckles (Lookout Valley)** – His backyard adjoins the Little's property. He voiced opposition because of too many new visitors and strangers in the neighborhood; inability to get acquainted or communicate with renters; and the possibility of increased noise.

- In response to Councilman Smith’s question on how the neighborhood voted on this matter, Mr. Curtis responded that the neighborhood was 100-percent against the rezoning and that he had 38 signatures on the petition distributed to the Council. Councilman Smith clarified that he was asking about the number of neighborhood association votes. Councilman Henderson informed the Council that the neighborhood association meeting had 13 members who voted to deny and three (3) who voted in favor.

Rebuttal on behalf of the Applicant:

- **Aaron Little (Scenic Waters Lane)** – He accused Councilman Henderson of coaching Mr. Fox on what to say about the neighborhood association. He stated that the number of units for the property has been misrepresented by neighbors on Facebook. He stated that he does not think the neighborhood knew what they were voting for.
 - Councilman Henderson refuted coaching Mr. Fox and informed the Council that he had asked Mr. Fox to report on what happened at the neighborhood meeting. He also disclosed publically that his property adjoins the Little’s property and, therefore, plans to abstain from making a motion or voting on this matter.

Councilman Gilbert informed Mr. Little that several districts have concerns about short-term vacation rentals. Councilman Smith suggested looking at the approval policy for special exceptions permits. Councilman Hakeem discussed the short term vacation rental that had been approved in his district and the fact that it did not have opposition from the community.

Councilman Hakeem moved to deny, seconded by Councilman Gilbert. Vice Chair Mitchell inquired about the Littles’ standing if new short-term vacation rental legislation is passed. Attorney Hinton confirmed that a denial today would not prevent the Littles from applying when new legislation is in place. The motion carried, with Councilman Anderson voting “NO” and Councilman Henderson abstaining.

In response to Councilman Gilbert’s question about the percentages of patients, Mr. Winnick informed the Council that the facility would serve everybody in the community. Mr. Winnick also informed the Council of the partnership with Acadia Health that, he stated, follows the same tenants as Erlanger in serving those who do not otherwise have access to needed services, regardless of their ability to pay. **The motion carried, with Councilman Gilbert abstaining from the vote.**

DEPARTMENTAL REPORTS:

Fire Department

Fire Chief Chris Adams introduced Fire Marshal William Matlock to update the Council on the Fire Marshal's division. He discussed included information on the following:

- "Get Alarm" with State Fire Marshal: 100 for 100 Challenge – CFD surpassed the challenge of installing 100 smoke alarms in one day by installing 218 working smoke alarms free of charge in one day.
- Smoke detectors, hand tools and batteries added to tool boxes on all equipment
- July 26, 2016 – CFD canvassed the area around 1725 Rubio, where there had been one (1) fire fatality. CFD installed 21 alarms and replaced 11 batteries.
- Smoke Alarm Install on November 5, 2016 – (Time and location to be announced)
- Fire Prevention Week from October 9-15, 2016 – Will include fire education in all local schools and a poster contest for every grade level.
- FY16 Review in Numbers: 4,917 fire and life-safety inspections; 272 public events; 408 fire and life-safety plan review events.

Councilmen Gilbert expressed thanks on behalf of citizens for the installation of smoke alarm. Smith expressed appreciation for the department's report and commended them for the number of alarms installed in one day. Chairman Freeman expressed thanks and commended the department for their response time in the fire fatality mentioned and also at pool incident recently.
