COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

October 18, 2016 6:00 PM

CALL TO ORDER

Council Chairman Moses Freeman called the meeting to order. A quorum was present, including Vice Chair Jerry Mitchell and Council members Chris Anderson, Carol Berz, Russell Gilbert, Yusuf Hakeem, Chip Henderson and Ken Smith all present. City Attorney Wade Hinton and Council Clerk Nicole Gwyn, CMC, were also present. Councilman Larry Grohn was not present.

RECOGNITION OF PERSONS WISHING TO ADDRESS COUNCIL (Non-Agenda Items)

Attorney Hinton read the rules of procedure for persons wishing to address the Council on non-agenda items. After which, Chairman Freeman recognized the following persons:

 Basil Marceaux – He stated that he was a Marine and commented that the flag should not be used as advertisement. He asked the Council to move the U.S. flag behind speaker's podium. He distributed copies of a court appeal to the Council.

- Randy Brady (Chattanooga) He is a Public Works employee who has a grievance with the City. He asked the Council to form a board separate from Human Resources that would be neutral in hearing his grievance.
 - Chairman Freeman informed Mr. Brady that the Council does not hear grievance matters. He asked him to meet with the Chief Operating Officer, Maura Sullivan, after the meeting.
- Isabella Donmincan (Hixson) She informed the Council of some homeless individuals who are being pelted with rocks by older teens on bikes. She stated that some teens on bikes followed her car and heckled, but she was able to minister to them. She asked what could be done to circumvent these teens from harassing the elderly?
 - Councilman Smith informed her that the lieutenant who is over that Hixson zone was in the Assembly and would follow up with her on the matter.
- Franklin McCallie (Reed Avenue) He was concerned that the PILOT to renovate Jaycee Towers did not have adequate public notification. He also recommended that the City Attorney's Office prepare a staff report on the PILOT.
 - Councilman Anderson informed Mr. McCallie of the process for Council staff sending notices to the media. He also stated that if the Council does not receive the additional information it has requested from the Applicant, the Council did have the option to defer the matter if it so choses.
