# **Council's Election of Officers**

Councilman Byrd discussed receiving reports of businesses not complying with the Mayor's Executive Order suspending dine-in services. He also thanked CARTA, first responders, and Public Works for their essential services during the pandemic.

# **Domestic Violence**

Councilwoman Coonrod informed the Council of receiving hearing about increases in domestic violence during the emergency times. Councilwoman Berz commented on increased calls to the Family Justice Center and requested a report from Chief Roddy soon on domestic violence. Chief Roddy, who was an attendee in this electronic meeting, informed the Council that his department is preparing the numbers to report on this matter. Chief Roddy also responded to questions about enforcement of laws during the pandemic.
